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## DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

### **The Scriptures**

# Course Summary

## Year 1

### **Foundational Teaching and Ministry Program**

Before the experiential aspects of ministry can be explored, it is very important that each student has a firm foundation in the Word of God. This includes: the understanding of God's unconditional love, the balance between grace and faith, relationship with God, godly character, the basics of righteousness, the Holy Spirit, prosperity, Bible covenants, keys to personal growth, life vision, and much more.

## Year 2

### **Advanced Instruction and Ministry Learning Experience Program**

In the second year, the emphasis moves to experiential ministry. In small interaction groups, students learn to do the work of the ministry. They conduct weddings, funerals, and baby dedications. They learn to prepare and deliver messages, plan and promote conferences, run children's church, and more. Second-year students are required to complete a mission's learning experience. The program includes ample opportunity to cover the expenses of the mission experience through fundraising events. Students remember these missions as life-changing events and the highlight of their college experience. Important elective classes are also available to second-year students. Examples include: counseling and life guidelines, family, church planting, church history, church government, and others.

## Year 3

### **Year 3 Program**

The Third Year Program is designed to help Charis Bible College graduates identify and be equipped in their calling of either Business, Film and Production, Global Training, Leadership, Ministry, Practical Government or Worship Arts. CBC graduates choose a school of study and are also offered more sound, biblical classes that further their walk with Christ.

In compliance with **38 U.S. Code § 3679** Charis adheres to the following policies:

1. The State Approving Agency (SAA), or VA when acting in the role of the State Approving Agency, shall disapprove a course of education provided by an educational institution that has in effect a policy that is inconsistent with the areas below:

In accordance with Title 38 US Code 3679 subsection (e), this school adopts the following additional provisions for any students using U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs VA Chapter 33 or VR&E Chapter 31 benefits, while payment to the institution is pending from the VA. This school will not:

- Prevent the student's enrollment.
- Assess a late penalty fee to student.
- Require student secure alternative or additional funding.
- Deny their access to any resources (access to classes, libraries, or other institutional facilities) available to other students who have satisfied their tuition and fee bills to the institution.

2. However, to qualify for this provision, such students may be required to:

- Provide Chapter 33 Certificate of Eligibility (or its equivalent) or for Chapter 31, VA VR&E's contract with the school on VA Form 28-1905 by the first day of class.

Note: Chapter 33 students can register at the VA Regional Office to use E-Benefits to get the equivalent of a Chapter 33 Certificate of Eligibility. Chapter 31 student cannot get a completed VA Form 28-1905 (or any equivalent) before the VA VR&E case-manager issues it to the school.

- Provide written request to be certified, by completing Student Enrollment verification form each semester.
- Provide additional information needed to properly certify the enrollment as described in other institutional policies.

# Year 1

## Course Descriptions

Students must successfully complete 568.8 classroom hours.

Course titles are subject to change without notice.

### Fall Courses

#### **Biblical Worldview**

Evaluating current world issues in light of the eternal truths of the word of God.

#### **A Sure Foundation**

Two subjects are covered in this class. *The Integrity of the Word* expounds on the truth, surety, and infallibility of God's Word. *Christian Philosophy* shows us that we all have a system of thought but challenges us to examine if it is according to the Word or the world.

#### **Basics of Righteousness**

This class teaches about our Spirit, Soul, and Body and Identity in Christ. Spirit, Soul, and Body is a study that explains how our spirits are complete in Jesus if we are born again and how our souls and bodies should relate to our spirits. The Identity in Christ study shows us from Scripture who we are in Christ—our righteousness and justification.

#### **Foundational Principles**

This course is based on Hebrews 1 & 2. The writer calls these things the principals of the doctrine of Christ. From these foundational truths we are to move on to achieve the goal set for us by God.

#### **Fruit of the Spirit**

God's very first words to man connects our success in life to our fruitfulness (Gen. 1:28). The kind of fruit each believer is called to produce is described in Gal. 5:22-23. This is a picture of the life and nature of Jesus. This course is an in-depth study of each aspect of the fruit of the Spirit. You will learn the purpose, the rewards, and the means to fully develop and manifest the fruit of the Spirit in your life and ministry.

#### **Healing**

The Christian life includes physical health for all who believe. It is as much God's will that we be physically whole as it is that we be born again. Before anyone can have faith for healing, they must be certain of God's will. Faith cannot go beyond the knowledge of God's will and God's ways in the area of health and healing. This course will establish principles for health and healing and will explain healing in terms of the spirit, soul, and body of man. We will learn what is required of us as faith-filled Christians, and what is God's part in the process of receiving health in our bodies.

#### **Holy Spirit I**

An exciting class that discusses the person and the work of the Holy Spirit. Not only will you learn how He has worked throughout history, but how He works in your life.

#### **Holy Spirit II**

A continuing teaching to conclude Holy Spirit I. These are exciting classes that discuss the person and the work of the Holy Spirit. Not only will you learn how He has worked throughout history, but how He works in your life.

**Introduction to the Bible**

A course designed to inspire confidence in the Bible as the Living Word of God by understanding its 1) revelation, 2) inspiration, 3) compilation, and 4) preservation.

**Life Foundations**

In the Life Foundations course, you will learn 6 key foundational truths that will revolutionize your relationship with God, empower you to overcome every attack of the enemy, and give you the ability to minister to anyone, at any time about anything. The most important part of a structure is its foundation. These truths will help you establish a firm foundation in the Word of God.

**Marriage and Family**

This course will show what the Bible says about God's plan and purpose for marriage.

**New Covenant Prayer**

Communicating with God is a major part of our relationship with Him. This course is about what prayer can be like in light of the New Covenant. Topics include friendship with God, worship, hearing His voice, praying for others, and doing what we see the Father do. There will be a focus on scriptural examples and real-life application.

**Possess the Land**

In this course you will come to understand the relationship between the children of Israel possessing the Promised Land, and believers possessing the 'Land of Promises.' What does it mean to possess the Truth, possess eternal life, our new identity in Christ, our thought life, and God's prosperity? Finally, how do we drive out the enemy who comes to steal, kill, and destroy?

**Principles of Grace and Faith**

The purpose of this course is to understand what grace and faith is and how they operate in our relationship towards God and how they operate towards those around us in our daily life. This course is designed to bring the Christian into a balance of receiving God's grace by faith and demonstrating that grace to all those around us.

**Prosperity God's Way**

This course is designed to help students develop the right relationship with money and run the love of money out of their soul. Jesus tells us in Luke 16 that faithfulness in that which is least—money—will qualify us to be entrusted with true riches—eternal souls. These lessons will establish the student in the purpose of prosperity; identify the real enemies of prosperity; and teach the right attitudes to develop toward finances.

**Relationship with God I**

This study emphasizes four important truths about God and man's relationship with Him. The Nature of God is a study of God that distinguishes between His character and His acts, contrasting the Old Testament with the New Testament. Hardness of Heart deals with one of the major barriers that keep us from accepting all of God's truth. Authority of the Believer helps us receive the blessings God has for us and shows us how to stop Satan from robbing us. God's Not Guilty shows us from Scripture that God is not the author of our problems, nor does He cause bad things to happen to us.

## **Romans**

Romans—the revelation of righteousness. The Book of Romans is considered by many as the greatest exposition of Christian Doctrine anywhere in the Bible. The revelation of righteousness is the revelation of the gospel. In this class we see the need for the provision of, the way to, and the power of righteousness revealed in Christ and received by faith.

## **Taking No Offence**

Offence is a mouse trap; it can rob you of God's best for your life. Learn how to identify offence and how walking in forgiveness can help overcome offence in any situation.

## **The Heart Essence of the Gospel**

Guilt, Condemnation, and Fear seem to be the motivating factors that define many Christians lives. Guilt, Condemnation, and Fear have been passed down from generation to generation because believers have been ignorant to the Heart or “Essence” of the Gospel, and for generations people have struggled to believe the truth of the “Almost too Good to be True Gospel.” Because of the ignorance and lack of understanding concerning the “Essence” of the Gospel, very few people know and relate to God the way that He is revealed in the New Testament. The “Essence” of the Gospel is all about God revealing His goodness, love, mercy, grace and forgiveness and true nature to a tired, worn out, and hopeless world!

## **Time Management**

Learn first how to surrender time to the Lord so he can dictate our lives. Once he shows you his will for your day, learn how to prioritize and set goals to accomplish what the lord has ordained over your life.

## **Fall and Spring Courses**

### **Dynamics of Christian Living – I and II**

These class hours cover Praise and Worship, Chapel services, guest speakers, seminars, workshops, and conferences that are required attendance for students. They cover various topics of Christian living, testimonies, and real- application of the Word of God in our daily lives.

### **Discipleship Evangelism - I and II**

This course will allow students to study through Andrew Wommack's Discipleship Evangelism' curriculum within a small group context in a format which is interactive.

## **Spring Courses**

### **Basic Bible Doctrines**

Bible doctrine will be covered in this course. Subjects include The Scriptures Inspired, One True God and The Trinity, The Deity of Jesus Christ, The Fall and Salvation of Man, The Present-Day Ministry of the Holy Spirit, Divine Healing, The Return of Jesus Christ for His Church, and Heaven & Hell.

### **Biblical Ethics and Morals**

This course is a study of various ethical and moral issues from a Biblical perspective that affect a Christian's walk with God and influence with others, including those outside the church.

### **Biblical Worldview - I**

Evaluating current world issues in light of the eternal truths of the word of God.



### **Establishing a Prosperous Soul**

According to III John 2 our physical health and financial prosperity are linked to the relative prosperity of our soul. In this course you will learn the keys to establishing a prosperous soul. Some of these principles are finding rest in the presence of Jesus, removing judgments, having a right relationship with authority, being anchored in hope, walking in patience, etc. We will cover these and other essential principles with the end goal of your soul becoming prosperous.

### **Finally, My Brethren**

This insightful study through the first five and a half chapters of Ephesians will cover the foundational steps that Apostle Paul laid out before his often-quoted statements about putting on your spiritual armor. This course will enlighten new scriptural truths and empower you to become more than a conqueror in spiritual conflict.

### **Galatians**

Paul's inspired letter which is often referred to as the "Magna Carta" of Christian liberty is reviewed and studied in terms of its great themes: grace, revelation, our identity in Christ, faith, the Law vs. the blessing of Abraham, and life in the Spirit.

### **Let Freedom Reign**

When we talk about freedom, it means different things to different people. For many believers, freedom in a Christian's life is only achieved through great sacrifice and hard work. When we have sacrificed and labored long and hard enough, we are ultimately rewarded with freedom: freedom from sin or freedom from bondage such as drugs, alcohol, pornography or whatever we perceive freedom to be. In this teaching we will discover that freedom in the New Testament is a gift.

Whenever you study the subject of freedom, as seen in the New Testament, there is a fundamental reality that we must understand about true freedom—in Christ we are all born free.

### **Love of God**

Come to understand how great God's love is for you. Experiencing God's love is not about what you do for Him, but accepting the love God is, has, and continues to demonstrate to you! Learn how the Word declares love over your life.

### **Operating in God's Best**

How to receive and operate in the blessings of God.

### **Overcoming Life's Difficulties**

God has made it possible for you to overcome all of life's challenges. It is His will that you live in victory! In this course, you will learn not only how to be an overcomer but also the rewards for overcoming.

### **Prayers Minister Training**

This course is applicable for any believer who wants to be trained in "how to minister" to those in need of healing, providing instruction not only on what the Bible says about healing, wholeness, and health, but also how to minister to those dealing with sickness and disease. This is practical hands-on training and will be a catalyst for a more effective healing ministry in Jesus name.

**Receiving from God I**

This class covers the subjects of Prayer, Healing, Blessings and Miracles, and Harnessing Your Emotions.

**Receiving from God II**

Continuation of Receiving from God I. This class covers the subjects of Prayer, Healing, Blessings and Miracles, and Harnessing Your Emotions.

**Relationship with God II**

A continuation of Relationship with God I. This study emphasizes four important truths about God and man's relationship with Him. The Nature of God is a study of God that distinguishes between His character and His acts, contrasting the Old Testament with the New Testament. Hardness of Heart deals with one of the major barriers that keep us from accepting all of God's truth. Authority of the Believer helps us receive the blessings God has for us and shows us how to stop Satan from robbing us. **Sexual Stewardship**

Learn how our sexuality is a gift of God yet to be guided and protected with the wisdom of the Word and practical everyday principles.

**Fundamentals of Faith**

There is a vertical side of faith which is faith towards God, however there is also a horizontal side of faith which is the walk of faith in our natural life. # Year 2 Course Descriptions

Year 2 students must successfully complete 568.8 classroom hours to earn a Non-Accredited Associate Degree in Biblical Studies. Course titles are subject to change without notice.

## **How to Get Along with People**

Someone once said, “If it weren’t for people, the ministry would be great.” However, the ministry is all about people, so it’s critically important to learn how to develop relationships and develop them with the right people. When conflict does arise—and it will—it’s also crucial to know how to resolve that conflict according to the Word of God. God’s solution works, but you have to know it to put it into practice.

## **How to Study the Bible**

This course is designed to show the student how to study the Bible in a useable way in their daily lives. In this course we will first look at the importance of the systematic study of the Scriptures and then show the practical steps on how to do it. In this course the student will learn how to outline verses of scripture, how to use reference materials to assist in their study, and how to use bible software programs on a PC or tablet to get the most out of their study of the Word of God. The goal of this course is to equip students to study the Bible for themselves and to make it a daily discipline in their life.

## **Biblical Leadership**

This course will lay a foundation for the growth and development of the student as a leader. Various Bible leaders and attributes will be studied. We will uncover the leadership mystery of why some leaders succeed and others fail. Growth, creativity, influence, team building, and many other attributes of leadership will be covered.

## **Lifestyle of Intimacy**

Discover how to build and enjoy a vibrant relationship with God. Come to know that relationship with God is not just on Sundays or in a crisis, but it is a lifestyle. Learn keys to knowing God better than ever before!

## **New Testament Survey I**

This is an overview of the New Testament that notes its place in God’s revelation to man. In this class, students will study the author, historical setting, purpose, and theme of each book; special attention is given to some of the key passages.

## **Living in Balance**

Life is filled with temptations to live in extremes. A successful and stress-free life and ministry requires achieving a proper balance between sure principles that seem to oppose one another. This course will help you live in a healthy tension between the following principles: grace and faith, the ministry of the Word and the Spirit, vision and wisdom, sound doctrine and unity of the brethren, love and discipline, compassion and confrontation, forgiveness, and trust, and being led by the Spirit and submission to authority.



**Laws of the Kingdom**

A study of the spiritual laws that govern creation and how we can cooperate with those laws in order to enjoy victorious Christian living.

**Wisdom and Maturity**

Wisdom and maturity aren't automatic or by chance. We can be intentional about the depth of our growth. This course is about the core concepts and practical skills that make us unshakeable and unstoppable.

**Biblical Basis for Missions**

The purpose of this course is to address one of the most misunderstood subjects in the body of Christ today—Missions! Through the study of the scriptures, the Biblical Basis of Missions teaching will bring a biblical understanding of what the Great Commission is, to whom it is given, and the challenge that is before us.

**Practical Skills for Godly Relationships**

One of the greatest challenges in life is to get along with other people around us, may it be in the workplace, at home and at Church or in ministry. Up to 87% of our success in life is directly related to our ability to get along with other people. The problem with relationships is that 90-95% of the people that we deal with in life are either moderately or severely insecure people. To compound this, most of the time we are also insecure ourselves and herein lies the problem. There is nothing that kills a relationship or a vision, and a ministry quicker than personal and unresolved insecurities. It is important to realize that getting along with other people has more to do with us than it has to do with them. Even though knowing God's love will effortlessly change us and influence the way we relate to others, we sometimes still need to practically work on getting along with other people.

**Bible Covenants**

Learn about the nature of God as revealed in the covenants He made with people. Explore God's covenant with Adam, Abraham, and Israel, and then consider the New Covenant fully revealed in the New Testament.

**How to Flow in the Gifts**

God gives us specific instruction in I Cor. 12:1 not to be ignorant of spiritual gifts. Yet this is something many Christians and churches are most ignorant about. These wonderful gifts are given to us to access when our knowledge of the Word (not the Word) and natural resources are not enough to get ourselves and others through a difficult time in life. The basis of our study will be from I Cor. 12, 13, & 14. The goal of this course is to equip each student to understand, be comfortable with, and be confident in releasing and operating the gifts in order. We will provide time during class to activate the gifts.

**Mission Trip Vision**

Prepare for cross-cultural ministry. Learn spiritual truths and practical tips for planning short-term mission trips for maximum impact.

### **Faith in a Supernatural God**

This subject deals with recognizing the ability of God through our lives in ministry. Learning how to appropriate the supernatural ability of God in our lives, it deals with the supernatural powers that be, including: 1) Angelic, 2) Demonic Spirits, 3) The overcoming victorious powers of our Lord.

### **Answers to Important Questions I**

A course designed to answer the most prevalent questions that many Christians have concerning the Bible and the ways of God in the world. Questions to be answered will include those dealing with suffering and tragedies, the Trinity, Job, Paul's thorn, Ananias and Sapphira, Sabbath keeping and many others.

### **Holy Spirit III**

This is an exciting class that discusses the Person and the work of the Holy Spirit. Not only will you learn how He has worked throughout history, but how He works in your life.

### **Interaction Groups**

This will introduce many practical skills that will help students become better public speakers and ministers.

### **Ten Essentials of Godly Leadership**

Learn the ten essential leadership qualities that develop first out of your relationship with God.

### **Vision Development**

Learn the process of discovering, communicating, and stepping into a God given vision while not wasting time walking in wrong directions.

### **Dynamics of Christian Living**

These class hours cover Praise and Worship, Chapel Services, Guest Speakers, Seminars, Workshops and Conferences that require student attendance. They cover various topics of Christian living, testimonies, and application of the Word of God in our daily lives.

## **Spring Courses**

### **Teaching and Preaching Effectively**

### **Fall Term:**

#### **Basic CEO Training I**

This course is designed to provide you with the knowledge needed to build a strong corporate organization. It details and provides insight into building, motivating, directing, training, and equipping a team to accomplish a purpose and vision, all from a scriptural basis.

#### **Business 101**

This course will teach you foundational principles of business formation, structure and operation, and will cover general principles not fully developed in other courses to connect the dots between all courses taught.

#### **Business 102 – The Founder**

This will include application of the principles taught to this point in the year by analyzing McDonalds, using the movie The Founder as a springboard for discussion and analysis.

#### **Business Law I**

This course will give you an in-depth understanding of the myriad laws a business must be aware of. From basic to complex, you will gain an appreciation for the legal requirements of being in business. Along with practical examples that illustrate the areas discussed.

#### **Business Research**

This course is designed to introduce you to business research. It will expose you to different ways of obtaining information through free research. It provides hands on access to the extensive resources and data bases available at the Pikes Peak Library system in Colorado Springs.

#### **Change Mastery**

This course is designed to give you the principles for navigating change. This course offers a spiritual and practical guide to become the master of change in your life.

#### **Core Value Index: Tools for Life and Leadership I**

The Course will show you how to use the Core Value Index in building your organization and team.

#### **Corporate Finance Funding**

This course is designed to provide you with the basic knowledge needed evaluate and value a business.

#### **Developing Healthy Relationships**

This course will help you identify relationships the Lord is connecting in your life while freeing you from guilt over failures in past relationships. You will learn the character traits of healthy relationships, how to overcome the spirit of offence, how to have healthy conflict resolution, and other important relationship lessons that will equip you to establish meaningful and successful relationships in your life and ministry.

#### **Harvard Business Reviews**

This course is designed to expose the students to select Harvard Business Review articles which are read outside of class and then discussed in class. ### **Live Plan 101 w/ Labs**

The Live Plan course is hands on business planning using a cloud-based solution. Live Plan is easily formulated, develop, and finalize a complete, professional business plan through a sequence of easy-to-fill-in forms and questionnaires.

### **Marketing 101**

This is an introductory course in Marketing. It examines the role of Marketing in our society, businesses and within organizations. Topics include the 4 P's of Marketing, taking the Vision and bringing it to pass through Marketing, understanding the structure of a Marketing Plan, how a SWOT contributes to a Marketing Plan, taking the findings from the Business Model Canvas and effectively incorporating them into a Marketing Plan, the secret to a successful marketing plan, hands on application, introduction to digital marketing, case studies of the above, and more.

### **Microfinance**

This course is designed to cast a vision for marketplace missions in any country.

### **Money Mastery**

This course will teach you that money is a tool, and one to be used wisely. You will learn about investing and obtaining the path to having your money work for you instead of you working for money.

### **Myers Briggs Type indicator**

The purpose of the Myers-Briggs Type Indicator® (MBTI®) personality inventory is to make the theory of psychological types described by C. G. Jung understandable and useful in people's lives.

### **Organizational Mastery**

Exploring Biblical principles relating to setting up your own organization or ministry.

### **Personal Finance 102 -Lessons from Rich Dad Poor Dad**

### **Developing Healthy Relationships**

This course will help you identify relationships the Lord is connecting in your life while freeing you from guilt over failures in past relationships. You will learn the character traits of healthy relationships, how to overcome the spirit of offence, how to have healthy conflict resolution, and other important relationship lessons that will equip you to establish meaningful and successful relationships in your life and ministry.

### **Emotional Intelligence**

### **Global Pathways**

# Year 3 Ministry School

## Course Descriptions

Students must successfully complete 568.8 classroom hours to earn a Certificate of Completion in Ministry. Course titles are subject to change without notice.

### **Basic CEO Training I**

Essential basic business skills applied from a ministry perspective.

### **Church Government**

An overview of the New Testament pattern of local church government, offices and giftings.

### **Developing Healthy Relationships**

This course will help you identify relationships the Lord is connecting in your life

while freeing you from guilt over failures in past relationships. You will learn the character traits of healthy relationships, how to overcome the spirit of offence, how to have healthy conflict resolution, and other important relationship lessons that will equip you to establish meaningful and successful relationships in your life and ministry.

### **Electives Fall**

Students can select a course of their choice for classes on topics including Biblical Studies, Children's Ministry, Youth Ministry, Pastoral Studies, Evangelism and Ministry of Helps.

### **Evangelism**

This course mixes instruction with practical experience as students take the classroom out to the local communities through ministry outreach.

### **Global Pathways**

This course will train the student how to keep the main thing the main thing in church life. No matter what our individual calling is each of us has the responsibility to do our part in fulfilling the Great Commission – Mat. 28:19-20. Students will be trained in the essential leadership principles involved in keeping a church/ministry “missions focused” rather than inward focused. The end goal of this is building healthy churches and ministries.

### **How to Counsel Effectively**

### **Fall Term Courses**

#### **Biblical Worldview of Government**

Because an accurate world view is critical to properly applying Truth in the arena of government, this series of courses will establish students in the Biblical principles that will enable them to correctly evaluate and stand for Christ on the issues of our day. Topics include creation, redemption, God's providence, the Biblical understanding of the rights of man, the Kingdom of God and others.

#### **Christian Influence in the Public Square**

Here, we will teach students how to engage in the political process at the grass roots level. We will explain the keys to grass roots activism, including engagement of elected officials, networking, monitoring legislation and policy developments, and party-political processes.

#### **Civil Rights and The History of Race in American**

This class will review the history of race relations in America. We will cover the little-known contributions of African American patriots in the fight for independence, and beyond. Students will learn about Constitutional Amendments and legislation relating to equality under the law. We will also review various laws covering civil rights, including those affecting age, gender, race and disability discrimination.

#### **Constitution Alive**

Practical Government Students will receive thorough instruction regarding the United States Constitution, the longest serving Constitution of any nation in the world. This first in a series of courses will teach the history of the Constitution, the Christian character of the document, an overview of its framework and provisions, as well as a review of the Amendments other than the Bill of Rights, which is covered in depth in a subsequent class. They will examine the founding fathers to see if America was formed as a biblical nation.

#### **Core Value Index: Tools for life & Leadership I**

The Course will show you how to use the Core Value Index in building your organization and team.

#### **Culture Impact Teams**

Students will learn how to organize, inform and mobilize their local church to influence the culture for Christ, using a basic program available through Family Research Council, and applying principles of "Discipling Nations".

#### **Developing Healthy Relationships**

This course will help you identify relationships the Lord is connecting in your life while freeing you from guilt over failures in past relationships. You will learn the character traits of healthy relationships, how to overcome the spirit of offence, how to have healthy conflict resolution, and other important relationship lessons that will equip you to establish meaningful and successful relationships in your life and ministry.

#### **Geopolitical Israel: Ancient to Contemporary**

How a nation relates to the Nation of Israel and the Jewish people is a fundamental aspect of policy. In this class, we will instruct students on the Biblical status of modern Israel as well as the History of the modern state of Israel and the Arab / Israeli conflict.

**Government According to the Bible**

This course will cover the purpose, role and proper sphere of government according to the Bible. It will also establish principles of good government according to Scripture, such as the republican form, separation of functions, civil rights, due process, civil disobedience, “natural law”, the doctrine of lesser magistrates and many others. Students will learn what the Founders believed about these subjects and how their beliefs were rooted in the Christian faith and scripture.

**Legislative Process**

Here, students will learn how legislatures operate, the life and process of a “bill”, and strategies for effectiveness in a legislative context. The course will cover the role of parties, committees, and officers. We will address legislative functions such as investigation, oversight, confirmation of appointments, impeachment, budgets, and constitutional amendments.

**Making your Next Speech Matter**

Students will learn how to prepare and deliver a compelling speech.

**Matters of Life and Death**

In “Matters of Life and Death,” we will address the fundamental rights to life and human reproduction. We will analyze the Scriptures and the law regarding the issues of our day where these subjects are implicated, including abortion, euthanasia, contraception, cloning and capital punishment.

**Media Relations & Labs**

Here, students will apply what they have learned in Media Relations in actual on-camera hostile medial interview settings with expert personal coaching.

**Organizational Mastery**

Exploring Biblical principles relating to setting up your own organization or ministry.

**Proverbs I, II & III**

This course will cover the unchangeable truths from the book of Proverbs—truths that transcend time and culture. Andrew demonstrates that Proverbs is practical wisdom for living life well.

**Real World Application of Biblical Worldview**

Here, Tim Barton builds on the foundational teachings of “Thinking Biblically” to address what a Biblical Worldview consists of and how it affects our approach to common issues in government today.

**Seven Mountains of Influence**

Human society is affected by seven primary arenas of influence, one of which is government. Other arenas of influence include the family, education, and the media. In this course, students will learn to identify the various arenas of society, and how they interact and overlap. Particular focus will be given to the importance and influence of Government. The concept developed by this course is a powerful key to unlocking the potential of the Church to fulfill the Great Commission.

**Team Building**

Learn how to recognize, recruit, and develop a team to come alongside of you in the vision God has not only given to you but also to the team that will help you fulfill the vision.

**The Black Robe Regiment**

They were prophets of liberty and truth. They bravely led their men onto the battlefield to face the Redcoats. They were hated and feared by the British who called them the “Black Robed Regiment.” Who were they? They were America's “patriot preachers” of the 18th century.

**Christian Heritage of American Gov I**

In this enlightening course, students will continue to explore the Christian heritage of American government, reviewing materials by David Barton and others, with a particular focus on the period from the American Revolution to the Civil War.



### **The First Amendment**

This course will provide students with a solid understanding of the 1st Amendment to the US Constitution, which recognizes freedom of religion, freedom of speech and of the press. We will provide the foundation necessary for a proper understanding of both the free exercise and the establishment clauses (freedom of religion), analyze the often-misunderstood phrase “separation of church and state”, and analyze the historical development of case law in this vital area.

### **The Role of the Church and Pastors in Government**

This very important course will inform students regarding the scriptural mandate and historical role that the Church and Pastors should play in the arena of government. We will address concerns that many may have which are rooted in misconceptions of “separation of church and state” and an overly narrow concept of modern “evangelism.” Students will be challenged and emboldened as they explore the truth about the views of our Founders, the history of the “Black Robe Regiment,” actual Supreme Court case law, concepts and examples from Scripture, U.S. Tax law and other sources.

### **Thinking Biblically**

In this transformative course, David Barton will explore how the Bible shaped the views of America’s founding fathers and ultimately America’s form of government and society. They will also identify issues facing governments on a daily basis and address how the Bible leads to certain principles that determine the proper resolution of those issues. Combining current events with Scriptural truth, the students will realize how their own thinking on important governmental issues can become more consistent with the teachings of the Bible.

### **Understanding Local Government**

Students in this course will discover the “ins and outs” of local government, including jurisdictions structures, types of board and commissions, inter-relationship with state and federal agencies and typical opportunities for citizen involvement.

### **Understanding the Military**

Students will learn the vital role the US Military plays in the defense of our nation, as well as an overview of its structure, powers, and limits. The course will also review the concepts of a “just war” and “nation building,” the things which our servicemen wish our leaders understood.

### **Who is the King?**

This course reveals the history of governments gravitation toward ever increasing power from ancient times to the present and explains the uniqueness of the American experiment and the Christian roots of freedom.

### **Sweet Land of Liberty**

Bishop E.W. Jackson’s life story unites Americans around a shared legacy of freedom. As a great grandson of slaves, he believes that the promise of liberty has always belonged to all Americans. For some, only their heirs would be the full beneficiaries. Nonetheless, the Declaration of Independence marked the inevitable death of the ancient world as surely as it proclaimed the birth of a new nation. Jackson sees the history of America as the epic story of flawed human beings achieving an unprecedented victory for freedom. He does not wallow in the bitterness of the past but inspires all Americans to embrace the promise of liberty.

### **Discipling Nations**

Here, Joshua Lwere, a national leader in the church in Uganda, explains the Great Commission’s injunction to make disciples of nations, and the principles that he has used in leading the ongoing transformation of that nation.

## **Fall and Spring Term Courses**

### **Practical Government Dynamics – Fall / Spring**

These class hours cover Praise and Worship, Chapel Services, Guest Speakers, Seminars, Workshops and Conferences that require student attendance. They cover various topics of Christian living, testimonies, and practical application of the Word of God in our daily lives.

## **Spring Term Courses**

### **Apologetics & Debate**

The Bible and the Christian faith are under attack in the arena of government. To champion Biblical principles and values, those who enter the public arena must have the knowledge and skills to defend fundamental Biblical truths. In this course, guest professor of apologetics, Alex McFarland will review factual and persuasive arguments that support the Christian worldview.

### **Biblical Worldview III**

Evaluating current world issues in light of the eternal truths of the word of God.

### **Christian Heritage of American Gov II**

In this continuation, students will continue to explore the Christian heritage of American government, reviewing materials by David Barton and others, with a particular focus on the period from the American Revolution to the Civil War.

### **Colorado General Assembly**

Students will tour the Capitol building in Denver Colorado. They will visit the Senate and House chambers to sit in on the General Assembly.

### **Conflict Resolution**

Learn the skills necessary to powerfully resolve conflict and opposition in a godly way, so to walk free of the emotional distractions that try to sabotage healthy relationships and ministries.

### **Core Value Index: Tools for Life & Leadership II**

This course will show how to use the Core Value Index in building your organization and team.

### **Discover Develop Deploy**

As the Practical Government School curriculum nears completion, Pastor Mark will lead the students on an assessment of what God has done in their lives through the year, drawing on the principles laid out in the opening course of Discover, Develop and Deploy, to help them identify with confidence God's direction in their lives.

### **Divine Guidance**

Facing tough decisions? Confused about the direction of your life? As sons and daughters of Christ, we have a Divine Guidance system that is ours. We must simply activate the connection and follow. Sound too simple? The key is to seek that guidance, and the primary source is the Holy Spirit speaking to your spirit. **The Miracle of America**

The founding of the United States of America changed the course and history of the World. In this class, students will learn the historical proof that America was birthed by the miraculous hand of God. We will study, among other things, God's intervention in events at pivotal moments, the inspiration our founders drew from God's word and their own relationship with Him, and the analogies between the founding of America for God's purpose and the deliverance of Israel from bondage in Egypt.

**Understanding the Threat**

Former US Marine Corps officer and FBI Officer John Guondolo demonstrates in shocking and riveting detail the agenda and infiltration of radical Islamic Jihad in American government and society.

**US Constitution**

In this course, students will explore "in-depth" the structure of the United States Constitution, and review the enumerated powers granted to the federal government. They will also examine in detail the principles of "separation of powers" and "checks and balances" in the Constitution. This course builds on US Constitution I to provide the students with understanding necessary to prepare them to be informed, involved and effective citizens. They will walk away with a great understanding that the writers of the constitution intended America to be a Godly nation.

**City of Woodland Park Tour**

Students will tour the city of Woodland Park learning about the water treatment plant, the city jail, city council and the aquatic center.

**The Crash Courses: Constitution & Socialism**

Students will have a comprehensive crash course on the Constitution and Socialism.

**The Judiciary and the Courts**

Students will study the Constitutional role of courts in American government and the historical roots of the judiciary. They will be instructed in the legal concepts of personal and subject matter jurisdiction, due process, the jury system, classifications of law, the roles of trial versus appellate courts, the doctrines of stare decisis, and res judicata. The course will also cover the anatomy of a lawsuit, a primer on criminal law, and the methods and procedures for election, appointment and removal of judges.

## Course Descriptions

Students must successfully complete 416 total hours of in class and online hours to earn a completion certificate. Course titles are subject to change without notice.

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| <p><b>A Sure Foundation</b></p> <p>Two subjects are covered in this class. <i>The Integrity of the Word</i> expounds on the truth, surety, and infallibility of God's Word. <i>Christian Philosophy</i> shows us that we all have a system of thought but challenges us to examine if it is according to the Word or the world.</p>  |
| <p><b>Basic Bible Doctrines</b></p> <p>Bible doctrine will be covered in this course. Subjects include The Scriptures Inspired, One True God and The Trinity, The Deity of Jesus Christ, The Fall and Salvation of Man, The Present-Day Ministry of the Holy Spirit, Divine Healing, The Return of Jesus Christ for His Church, and Heaven &amp; Hell.</p>   |
| <p><b>Basics of Righteousness</b></p> <p>This class teaches about our Spirit, Soul, and Body and Identity in Christ. Spirit, Soul, and Body is a study that explains how our spirits are complete in Jesus if we are born again and how our souls and bodies should relate to our spirits. The Identity in Christ study shows us from Scripture who we are in Christ—our righteousness and justification.</p>  |
| <p><b>Biblical Ethics and Morals</b></p> <p>This course is a study of various ethical and moral issues from a Biblical perspective that affect a Christian's walk with God and influence with others, including those outside the church.</p>  |
| <p><b>Discipleship Evangelism Groups</b></p> <p>This course has been designed so that anyone, at anytime, anywhere can reach an unbeliever, disciple new believers, or grow with others in the Lord. Students will get a chance to teach a lesson. This totals 8 hours of DE class hours over the course of the year.</p>  |
| <p><b>Dynamics of Christian Living Fall &amp; Spring</b></p> <p>These class hours cover Praise and Worship, Chapel services, guest speakers, seminars, workshops, and conferences that are required attendance for students. They cover various topics of Christian living, testimonies, and real-world application of the Word of God in our daily lives.</p>   |
| <p><b>Biblical Worldview &amp; Biblical Worldview I</b></p> <p>Evaluating current world issues in light of the eternal truths of the word of God.</p>  |
| <p><b>Discipleship Evangelism I &amp; II</b></p> <p>This course will allow students to study through Andrew Wommack's Discipleship Evangelism' curriculum within a small group context in a format which is interactive.</p>   |
| <p><b>Foundation Principles</b></p> <p>This course is based on Hebrews 1 &amp; 2. The writer calls these things the principals of the doctrine of Christ. From these foundational truths we are to move on to achieve the goal set for us by God.</p>  |
| <p><b>Fruit of the Spirit</b></p> <p>God's very first words to man connects our success in life to our fruitfulness (Gen. 1:28). The kind of fruit each believer is called to produce is described in Gal. 5:22-23. This is a picture of the life and nature of Jesus. This course is an in-depth study of each aspect of the fruit of the Spirit. You will learn the purpose, the rewards, and the means to fully develop and manifest the fruit of the Spirit in your life and ministry.</p>   |
| <p><b>Healing</b></p> <p>The Christian life includes physical health for all who believe. It is as much God's will that we be physically whole as it is that we be born again. Before anyone can have faith for healing, they must be certain of God's will. Faith cannot go beyond the knowledge of God's will and God's ways in the area of health and healing. This course will establish principles for health and healing and will explain healing in terms of the spirit, soul, and body of man. We will learn what is required of us as faith filled Christians, and what is God's part in the process of receiving health in our bodies.</p> |

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| <p><b>Holy Spirit I &amp; II</b></p> <p>This is an exciting class that discusses the Person and the work of the Holy Spirit. Not only will you learn how He has worked throughout history, but how He works in your life.</p>   |
| <p><b>Introduction to the Bible</b></p> <p>A course designed to inspire confidence in the Bible as the Living Word of God by understanding its 1) revelation, 2) inspiration, 3) compilation, and 4) preservation.</p>  |
| <p><b>Life Foundations</b></p> <p>In the Life Foundations course, you will learn 6 key foundational truths that will revolutionize your relationship with God, empower you to overcome every attack of the enemy, and give you the ability to minister to anyone, at any time about anything. The most important part of a structure is its foundation. These truths will help you establish a firm foundation in the Word of God.</p>  |
| <p><b>Marriage and Family</b></p> <p>This course will show what the Bible says about God's plan and purpose for marriage.</p>   |
| <p><b>New Covenant Prayer</b></p> <p>Communicating with God is a major part of our relationship with Him. This course is about what prayer can be like in light of the New Covenant. Topics include friendship with God, worship, hearing His voice, praying for others, and doing what we see the Father do. There will be a focus on scriptural examples and real-life application.</p>   |
| <p><b>Possess the Land</b></p> <p>In this course you will come to understand the relationship between the children of Israel possessing the Promised Land, and believers possessing the 'Land of Promises.' What does it mean to possess the Truth, possess eternal life, our new identity in Christ, our thought life, and God's prosperity? Finally, how do we drive out the enemy who comes to steal, kill, and destroy?</p>   |
| <p><b>Principles of Grace and Faith</b></p> <p>The purpose of this course is to understand what grace and faith is and how they operate in our relationship towards God and how they operate towards those around us in our daily life. This course is designed to bring the Christian into a balance of receiving God's grace by faith and demonstrating that grace to all those around us.</p>  |
| <p><b>Prosperity God's Way</b></p> <p>This course is designed to help the student develop the right relationship with money and run the love of money out of his/her soul. Jesus tells us in Luke 16 that faithfulness in that which is least— money—will qualify us to be entrusted with true riches—eternal souls. These lessons will establish the student in the purpose of prosperity; identify the real enemies of prosperity and the right attitudes to develop toward finances.</p>   |
| <p><b>Relationship with God I &amp; II</b></p> <p>This study emphasizes four important truths about God and man's relationship with Him. The Nature of God is a study of God that distinguishes between His character and His acts, contrasting the Old Testament with the New Testament. Hardness of Heart deals with one of the major barriers that keep us from accepting all of God's truth. Authority of the Believer helps us receive the blessings God has for us and shows us how to stop Satan from robbing us. God's Not Guilty shows us from Scripture that God is not the author of our problems, nor does He cause bad things to happen to us.</p>   |
| <p><b>Romans</b></p> <p>Romans—The revelation of righteousness. The Book of Romans is considered by many as the greatest exposition of Christian Doctrine anywhere in the Bible. The revelation of righteousness is the revelation of the gospel. In this class we see: the need for the provision of, the way to and the power of righteousness revealed in Christ and received by faith.</p>  |
| <p><b>The Heart Essence of the Gospel</b></p> <p>Guilt, Condemnation, and Fear seems to be the motivating factors that define many Christian's lives. Guilt, Condemnation, and Fear among believers has been passed down from generation to generation because they have been ignorant of the Heart or "Essence" of the Gospel, and for generations people have struggled to believe the truth of the "Almost too Good to be True Gospel." Because of the ignorance and lack of understanding concerning the "Essence" of the Gospel, very few people know and relate to God the way that He is revealed in the New Testament. The "Essence" of the Gospel is all about God revealing His goodness, love, mercy, grace, and forgiveness and true nature to a tired, worn out, and hopeless world!</p> |

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| <p><b>Taking No Offence</b></p> <p>Offence is a mouse trap; it can rob you of God's best for your life. Learn how to identify offence and how walking in forgiveness can help overcome offence in any situation.</p>   |
| <p><b>Time Management</b></p> <p>Learn first how to surrender time to the Lord so he can dictate our lives. Once he shows you his will for your day, learn how to prioritize and set goals to accomplish what the lord has ordained over your life.</p>  |
| <p><b>Basic Bible Doctrines</b></p> <p>Bible doctrine will be covered in this course. Subjects include The Scriptures Inspired, One True God and The Trinity, The Deity of Jesus Christ, The Fall and Salvation of Man, The Present-Day Ministry of the Holy Spirit, Divine Healing, The Return of Jesus Christ for His Church, and Heaven &amp; Hell.</p>   |
| <p><b>Biblical Ethics and Morals</b></p> <p>This course is a study of various ethical and moral issues from a Biblical perspective that affect a Christian's walk with God and influence with others, including those outside the church.</p>  |
| <p><b>Sexual Stewardship</b></p> <p>Learn how our sexuality is a gift of God yet to be guided and protected with the wisdom of the Word and practical everyday principles.</p>   |
| <p><b>How to Hear God</b></p> <p>There are many different reasons why we need and want to hear God. This course will look at how to hear Him more clearly in any kind of situation. Whether it's for something big or little, for ourselves or for someone else, or our circumstances are peaceful or an emergency, we can hear God.</p>   |
| <p><b>Establishing a Prosperous Soul</b></p> <p>According to III John 2 our physical health and financial prosperity are linked to the relative prosperity of our soul. In this course you will learn the keys to establishing a prosperous soul. Some of these principles are finding rest in the presence of Jesus, removing judgments, having a right relationship with authority, being anchored in hope, walking in patience, etc. We will cover these and other essential principles with the end goal of your soul becoming prosperous.</p>   |
| <p><b>Finally, My Brethren</b></p> <p>This insightful study through the first five and a half chapters of Ephesians will cover the foundational steps that Apostle Paul laid out before his often-quoted statements about putting on spiritual armor. This course will enlighten new scriptural truths and empower you to become more than a conqueror in spiritual conflict.</p>  |
| <p><b>Galatians</b></p> <p>Paul's inspired letter which is often referred to as the "Magna Carta" of Christian liberty is reviewed and studied in terms of its great themes: grace, revelation, our identity in Christ, faith, the Law vs. the blessing of Abraham, and life in the Spirit.</p>  |
| <p><b>Let Freedom Reign</b></p> <p>When we talk about freedom, it means different things to different people. For many believers, freedom in a Christian's life is only achieved through great sacrifice and hard work. When we have sacrificed and labored long and hard enough, we are ultimately rewarded with freedom; freedom from sin or freedom from bondage such as from drugs, alcohol, pornography or whatever we perceive freedom to be. In this teaching we will discover that freedom in the New Testament is a gift. Whenever you study the subject of freedom, as seen in the New Testament, there is a fundamental reality that we must understand about true freedom; in Christ we are all born free.</p> |
| <p><b>Operating in God's Best</b></p> <p>How to receive and operate in the blessings of God.</p>   |
| <p><b>Prayer Ministry Program</b></p> <p>This course is applicable for any believer who wants to be trained in "how to minister" to those in need of healing, providing instruction not only on what the Bible says about healing, wholeness and health, but also how to minister to those dealing with sickness and disease. This is participatory and experiential course and will be a catalyst for a more effective healing ministry in Jesus' name.</p>   |
| <p><b>Receiving from God I, II</b></p> <p>This class covers the subjects of <i>Prayer, Healing, Blessings and Miracles, and Harnessing Your Emotions</i>.</p>  |

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| <p><b>Fundamentals of Faith</b></p> <p>In this course faith is defined and examined as well as what faith is not. There is a vertical side of faith which is faith towards God, however there is also a horizontal side of faith which is the walk of faith in our natural life. This course will expound on both sides of faith because both are needed to bring about God's plan and purpose in the earth.</p> |
| <p><b>Ministry of Jesus I &amp; II</b></p> <p>An overview of the culture and context of Jesus' life and ministry that will deal with His manner of teaching, the content of His teaching and His declarations about Himself, His relationship with the Father, the Word, the devil, sin, faith, prayer and the Holy Spirit.</p>  |
| <p><b>Love of God</b></p> <p>Come to understand how great God's love is for you. Experiencing God's love is not about what you do for Him, but accepting the love God is, has, and continues to demonstrate to you! Learn how the Word declares love over your life.</p>   |
| <p><b>Old Testament Foundations I</b></p> <p>Explore the Old Testament books of law and history. Discover how God revealed Himself and His ways to mankind and the historical roots of the New Covenant.</p>   |
| <p><b>Old Testament Foundations II</b></p> <p>Dive into the poetic and prophetic books of the Old Testament. Observe the wisdom of God and the progressive revelation of His plan of salvation as revealed through His prophets.</p>   |
| <p><b>Overcoming Life's Difficulties</b></p> <p>God has made it possible for you to overcome all of life's challenges. It is His will that you live in victory! In this course, you will learn not only how to be an overcomer but also the rewards for overcoming.</p>  |

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| <p><b>Answers to Important Questions I &amp; II</b></p> <p>A course designed to answer the most prevalent questions that many Christians have concerning the Bible and the ways of God in the world. Questions to be answered will include those dealing with suffering and tragedies, the Trinity, Job, Paul's thorn, Ananias and Sapphira, Sabbath keeping and many others.</p>  |
| <p><b>Bible Covenants</b></p> <p>Learn about the nature of God as revealed in the covenants He made with people. Explore God's covenant with Adam, Abraham, and Israel, and then consider the New Covenant fully revealed in the New Testament.</p>  |
| <p><b>Biblical Leadership</b></p> <p>This course will lay a foundation for the growth and development of the student as a leader. Various Bible leaders and attributes will be studied. We will uncover the leadership mystery of why some leaders succeed and others fail. Growth, creativity, influence, team building, and many other attributes of leadership will be covered.</p>   |
| <p><b>Dynamics of Christian Ministry</b></p> <p>These class hours cover Praise and Worship, Chapel Services, Guest Speakers, Seminars, Workshops and Conferences that require student attendance. They cover various topics of Christian living, testimonies, and real-world application of the Word of God in our daily lives.</p>  |
| <p><b>Electives</b></p> <p>Students can select courses of their choice for classes on various topics. They are required to take three electives per semester. This totals 48 hours of elective class hours over the course of the year.</p>  |
| <p><b>Faith in a Supernatural God</b></p> <p>This subject deals with recognizing the ability of God through our lives in ministry. Learning how to appropriate the supernatural ability of God in our lives, it deals with the supernatural powers that be, including 1) Angelic, 2) Demonic Spirits, and 3) The overcoming victorious powers of our Lord.</p>   |
| <p><b>Excellence in Ministry</b></p> <p>Maximize your ministry potential and increase your leadership skills and influence. Identify and establish the core values that will shape your character and increase your kingdom influence. Learn the essential traits that define a leader in the kingdom of God.</p>  |
| <p><b>Foundational Truths for Godly Ministry</b></p> <p>Since day one in the garden it has always been God's intention and purpose that every man, woman and child, find and live a life that is comfortable, gracious, and pleasant! Living our dreams both in lives and ministry does not only come with the gifting God has given you, or the opportunities you have but by the process of habitually practicing, exercising, and preparing your gifting! There is nothing more beautiful for God our Father, than to see us find and live as it were (in the sweet spot) of our lives and ministry.</p>  |
| <p><b>Goal of the Cross</b></p> <p>Learn that the goal of the Cross was to reveal the depths of God's love and teach you how to have a deep life changing relationship! Learn how to grow in greater understanding as you see this amazing love story towards you open up through study of the Word!</p>   |
| <p><b>How to Flow in the Gifts</b></p> <p>God gives us specific instruction in I Cor. 12:1 not to be ignorant of spiritual gifts. Yet this is something many Christians and churches are most ignorant about. These wonderful gifts are given to us to access when our knowledge of the Word (not the Word) and natural resources are not enough to get ourselves and others through a difficult time in life. The basis of our study will be from I Cor. 12,13, &amp; 14. The goal of this course is to equip each student to understand, be comfortable with, and be confident in releasing and operating the gifts in order. We will provide time during class to activate the gifts.</p> |

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| <p><b>The Spirit Empowered Life</b></p> <p>In this course we learn why and how the Holy Spirit is the "key player" of this new covenant. His 7 works in and through the believer will empower him to live the resurrected life in Christ so that it is no longer he who lives but Christ who lives in him, and us.</p>   |
| <p><b>Apologetics</b></p> <p>In this course we will review factual and persuasive arguments that support the Christian worldview along with teaching the skills needed to defend fundamental Biblical truths in the public arena.</p>  |
| <p><b>Biblical Worldview II</b></p> <p>Evaluating current world issues in light of the eternal truths of the word of God.</p>  |
| <p><b>Church History</b></p> <p>This course will look at the history of the church throughout the ages.</p>  |
| <p><b>Teaching and Preaching Effectively</b></p> <p>Learn how to communicate the Word not only with the leading of the Holy Spirit but also using key principles of preparation and delivery for powerful impact.</p>  |
| <p><b>Vision Development</b></p> <p>Learn the process of discovering, communicating, and stepping into a God given vision while not wasting time walking in wrong directions.</p>  |
| <p><b>Wisdom and Maturity</b></p> <p>Wisdom and maturity aren't automatic or by chance. We can be intentional about the depth of our growth. This course is about the core concepts and practical skills that make us unshakeable and unstoppable.</p>   |
| <p><b>Advanced Bible Doctrines</b></p> <p>This course will equip the student to define and apply to their lives Biblical foundations dealing with God's plan for salvation and spiritual growth. The goal is to strengthen each student's spiritual life and walk and to cause their teaching ministry to be more effective.</p>   |
| <p><b>Lifestyle of Intimacy</b></p> <p>Discover how to build and enjoy a vibrant relationship with God. Come to know that relationship with God is not just on Sundays or in a crisis, but it is a lifestyle. Learn keys to knowing God better than ever before!</p>   |
| <p><b>Mission Trip Vision</b></p> <p>Prepare for cross-cultural ministry. Learn spiritual truths and practical tips for planning short-term mission's trips for maximum impact.</p>  |
| <p><b>Ten Essentials of Godly Leadership</b></p> <p>Learn the ten essential leadership qualities that develop first out of your relationship with God.</p>   |
| <p><b>How to Get Along with People</b></p> <p>Someone once said, "If it weren't for people, the ministry would be great." However, the ministry is all about people, so it's critically important to learn how to develop relationships and develop them with the right people. When conflict does arise—and it will—it's also crucial to know how to resolve that conflict according to the Word of God. God's solution works, but you have to know it to put it into practice.</p> |

**How to Study the Bible**

This course is designed to show the student how to study the Bible in a useable way in their daily lives. In this course we will first look at the importance of the systematic study of the Scriptures and then show the action steps on how to do it. In this course the student will learn how to outline verses of scripture, how to use reference materials to assist in their study, and how to use bible software programs on a PC or tablet to get the most out of their study of the Word of God. The goal of this course is to equip students to study the Bible for themselves and to make it a daily discipline in their life.

**Large IAG – Public Speaking**

This course will cover various topics related to speaking and teaching in public.

**Large IAG – Practical Ministry**

This will introduce many skills that will help students become better public speakers and ministers.

**In Christ Realities**

Get a fuller understanding of your new identity in Christ, the value of your identity in Christ, and how that identity helps you fulfill the purpose and plan of God for your life.

**Large IAG – Sacerdotal Duties**

This course will prepare students for ministry situations they may encounter in the future. Topics will include weddings, funerals, baby dedications, and more.

**Life of Christ**

God has given each of us a unique purpose and destiny to fulfill. Yet our highest purpose is to be conformed to the image of His Son – Rom. 8:28-29. This course is a study in how you may appropriate and manifest the life of Christ – His character and nature – in the earth today. The focus of this teaching is to help you identify and yield to the image of Christ and to walk in Christ-likeness.

**Living in Balance**

Life is filled with temptations to live in extremes. A successful and stress-free life and ministry requires achieving a proper balance between sure principles that seem to oppose one another. This course will help you live in a healthy tension between the following principles: grace and faith, the ministry of the Word and the Spirit, vision and wisdom, sound doctrine and unity of the brethren, love and discipline, compassion and confrontation, forgiveness and trust, and being led by the Spirit and submission to authority.

**Making of a Minister I & II**

Attend Bible College, complete the required courses, receive your ministerial license and ordination papers, and then you are a minister, right? Wrong! God's ways are not man's ways. This course will help you understand the difference between man's and God's qualifications for ministers. By the end of this course, you will either be determined to prepare your heart or stay as far away from ministry as possible.

**New Testament Survey I & II**

This is an overview of the New Testament that notes its place in God's revelation to man. In this class, students will study the author, historical setting, purpose, and theme of each book; special attention is given to some of the key passages.

**Practical Skills for Godly Relationships**

One of the greatest challenges in life is to get along with other people around us, may it be in the workplace, at home and at Church or in ministry. Up to 87% of our success in life is directly related to our ability to get along with other people. The problem with relationships is that 90-95% of the people that we deal with in life are either moderately or severely insecure people. To compound this, most of the time we are also insecure ourselves and herein lies the problem. There is nothing that kills a relationship or a vision, and a ministry quicker than personal and unresolved insecurities. It is important to realize that getting along with other people has more to do with us than it has to do with them. Even though knowing God's love will effortlessly change us and influence the way we relate to others, we sometimes still need to actively work on getting along with other people.

**The Laws of the Kingdom**

A study of the spiritual laws that govern creation and how we can cooperate with those laws in order to enjoy victorious Christian living.

**Walking in the Spirit**

Paul tells us to walk in the Spirit in Galatians 5:16, but he does not explain there what it means or how to do it. In this course you will learn scripturally what walking in the Spirit is and how to do it! You will also see how you can be led by the Spirit in every area of your life. This course will help you walk out God's plan for your life!

**Bible Basis for Missions**

The purpose of this course is to address one of the most misunderstood subjects in the body of Christ today - Missions! # Third Year Leadership Program

## Course Descriptions

Students must successfully complete 486 hours to earn a Certificate of Completion in Leadership. Course titles are subject to change without notice.

### **Achieving Your Financial Potential**

In this course you will learn Biblical principles of personal success, i.e. getting your personal financial house in order, planning for the future, and protecting what you have. You will also learn Biblical principles of business success, i.e. planning, diligence, organization, and building a business that runs without you.

### **Advice from an Old Minister to a Young Minister**

Andrew shares advice and wisdom that will help young ministers to survive and avoid discouragement and eventual burnout. Run your course strong from beginning to end and become a successful old minister.

### **Anatomy of Revival**

This course looks at the history and development of successful ministry and churches as seen through the book of Acts with an emphasis on the responsibilities of effective ministers.

### **Basic CEO I**

This course is designed to provide you with the knowledge needed to build a strong foundational corporate organization. It also details insights into building, motivating, directing, cultivating, and equipping a team for a powerful purpose and vision, all from a scriptural basis.

### **Building a Successful Business**

Learn more about how to grow a business, expanding and creating new systems to deal with new challenges.

### **Business Development Process**

In this course we will cover the 7 steps to developing your business, the 4 processes of a successful business or ministry, organizational accountability, strategic leadership, the 4 P's of position, planning, process, and performance and the leader's job description.

### **Business Model Generation Canvas**

This course is designed to introduce a powerful, simple, tested tool for understanding, designing, reworking, and implementing business models.

### **Business Planning**

In this course you will learn how to establish multiple streams of income to provide strength, consistency and redundancy in producing wealth. You will also learn how to analyze the market, develop your business idea, and evaluate the pros and cons of whether to buy a franchise or start your own business.

### **Change Mastery**

Learn how your success or failure is based on your ability to master the changes that come on a daily basis. Once you learn the skill, growth is an everyday lifestyle.

**Conflict Resolution**

Learn the skills necessary to powerfully resolve conflict and opposition in a godly way, so to walk free of the emotional distractions that try to sabotage healthy relationships and ministries.

**Dealing with Death**

How to organize and minister at a funeral and how to deal with death and grief.

**Developing Healthy Relationships**

This course will help you identify relationships the Lord is connecting in your life while freeing you from guilt over failures in past relationships. You will learn the character traits of healthy relationships, how to overcome the spirit of offence, how to have healthy conflict resolution, and other important relationship lessons that will equip you to establish meaningful and successful relationships in your life and ministry.

**Disc and Spiritual Giftings**

How to identify and walk in your spiritual giftings to further the kingdom.

**Dynamics of Christian Leadership**

These class hours cover Praise and Worship, Chapel Services, Guest Speakers, Seminars, Workshops and Conferences that require student attendance. They cover various topics of Christian living, testimonies, and real-world application of the Word of God in our daily lives.

**Effective Counseling**

This course covers the essential keys to effective counseling that keeps people pointed to and dependent upon Jesus, not the counselor. One of Jesus' names is Counselor therefore each of us has the Counselor in us and available to us. The student will also learn the pitfalls to avoid in counseling and be prepared in helping people deal with major marriage issues.

**Full Time Ministry Full Time Married**

Discover how the transition to full-time ministry can take your marriage to another level of unity, growth and fulfilling your God given destiny together.

**Goal Setting**

Students will be instructed on how to define and establish goals.

**Hearing God**

Learn how to hear God's voice clearly in every area of life.

**How to Disciple**

This course will help the student recognize several successful methods of making disciples. The focus will not be on what to teach as much as how to recognize who is a potential disciple, how to connect with them, and help them grow as a disciple of Jesus. We will cover the pitfalls of the mentoring

process, how to build trust with people, and many other important principles involved in the discipleship process.

### **How to Teach**

This course will help the student to understand the heart of a teacher and how God's Word and His principles for life can be transmitted in such a way as to impact others. A Biblical foundation for teaching will be established as well as the physical and spiritual dynamics of effectively communicating Bible truths in a relevant manner.

### **Leadership**

To discover and explain the necessary characteristics of one who can effectively become a leader of others.

### **Leadership 101**

Learn the differences between those who are pioneers for the sake of building the kingdom and those who build for their own gain and glory.

### **Making Cents**

In this course you will be taught the foundational principles for your personal finances from the Word.

### **Marketing Lifeblood of Business**

This course will give a real-world view of marketing focusing on key marketing concepts such as branding, relationship marketing, differentiation in the market, and use of social media and other traditional media formats. The course will also look at making strategic marketing decisions using customer analysis, competitor analysis, and company analysis.

### **Ministering to Singles**

A course dedicated to the understanding of the Biblical teaching on how to minister to those who are single, dating, and healthy relationships between the sexes.

### **Missions**

Reaching every person on earth with the Good News of redemption is God's greatest desire. We will study the implications of the Great Commission, how it gave rise to the spread of Christianity over the last two thousand years, and how it relates to the responsibility of our generation to reach the nations. Both historical and current missions and missionaries will be reviewed, and the real-world aspects of cross-cultural ministry will be explored.

### **Money Mastery**

This course will teach you that money is a tool, and one to be used wisely. You will learn about investing and obtaining the path to having your money work for you instead of you working for money.

### **Myers-Briggs**

Questionnaires to identify your strengths using the Meyers Briggs program.

### **Operating the Gifts in Order**

How to operate and flow in the Spiritual Gifts. Emphasis on ministering to others and releasing them in this powerful truth.

### **Practical Prosperity**

This course teaches a Biblical approach to financial prosperity. Some of the main topics covered are: what the Bible says about finances, wrong thinking, habits and attitudes, money management, priorities and budgeting, how to get out of debt and stay out of debt, making money work for you, and investing in yourself and your financial education.

### **Projects**

Step by step course on how to develop, plan and implement the launch of a ministry. You will develop a vision and mission statement, research demographics, determine a location, plan a startup budget, create simple marketing strategy. Class will include small group times for teamwork and presentation preparation.

### **Purpose of Marriage**

This course reveals the Biblical God given Purpose of Marriage. It stresses unselfishness, unfluctuating Love, and creating a Godly environment for Children.

### **Raising Leaders**

In Paul's letters to Timothy, Paul was instructing Timothy as "his son in the faith." This teaching covers vital and real-world aspects to prepare us for a lifetime of effective leadership.

### **Sound Doctrine**

Can you recognize false teaching when you hear it? Are you able to defend the foundational doctrines of the faith? This course will examine the roots and symptoms of false teaching and will help to establish the student in sound doctrine.

### **Teaching Labs**

Teaching Labs are where students get the chance to execute a teaching in front of a live audience. Constructive feedback is given from fellow students and staff members. Various tasks will be completed, including learning to use illustrations, statistics, visual aids, etc. to validate a point made.

### **Team Building**

Learn how to recognize, recruit and develop a team to come alongside of you in the vision God has not only given to you but also to the team that will help you fulfill the vision.

### **The Evolution of Ministry**

This course consists of how ministry and wisdom evolve synonymously. The material will cover the 4 stages of ministry, the Moses model, and the benefits of the 7 pillars of wisdom. Application of these principles will provide a solid foundation for a successful.

### **The Heart of a Pastor**

A course dedicated to the understanding of the one truly called to minister to God's people as a pastor and how that calling, and gift are developed and maintained.

### **Time Management**

Learn first how to surrender time to the Lord so he can dictate our lives. Once he shows you his will for your day, learn how to prioritize and set goals to accomplish what the lord has ordained over your life.

## Refunds

IN ACCORDANCE WITH VA REGULATION 38 C.F.R. § 21.4255-1

Students not accepted by the school and students who cancel the contract by notifying the school within three business days of the start of classes are entitled to a full refund of all tuition and fees paid. If any student withdraws after three business days, but before the commencement of classes, he/she is entitled to a full refund of all tuition and fees paid, including the registration fee in excess of \$10.

In the case of students withdrawing after the commencement of classes, the school will retain a cancellation fee, plus a percentage of tuition and fees, which is based on the percentage of contract hours attended as described in the table below. The refund is based on the last date of recorded attendance.

1. Students may cancel this contract at any time prior to the close of the third business day after signing the enrollment agreement but cannot be later than the close of the third day of school.
2. The official date of termination for refund purposes is the last date of recorded attendance. All refunds will be made within thirty days from the date of termination.



3. The VA or the student depending on the chapter benefit of the student will receive a full refund of tuition and fees paid if the school discontinues a course/program within a period of time that a student could have reasonably completed it, except that this provision shall not apply in the event the school ceases operation.
4. Complaints that cannot be resolved by direct negotiation between the student and the school may be filed with the Division of Private Occupational Schools of the Colorado Department of Higher Education. The Division shall not consider any claim that is filed more than two years after the date the student discontinues his/her training at the school.
5. We retain all VA students' records for three years following the ending date of the last period certified to the VA. This is in accordance with regulation 38 C.F.R. § 21.4209(f).
6. A student may request a transcript from the school by emailing the Registrar at registrar@awmcharis.com or going to the student helpdesk and requesting it.
